I have worked predominantly in community mental health for Queensland Health and Mater Health Services. Additionally, I worked in a Day Program setting, Mater Health Services from May 2001- 2004. This service is designed to provide intensive assessment, case management and individual and group based therapeutic interventions to children and adolescents with `community treatment resistant' and complex mental health difficulties.

This means that referrals are regularly received for young people with high levels of acuity and emotional distress including: self-harm behaviours; suicidal ideation; previous suicide attempts; eating disorders; psychosis and extreme behavioural difficulties.
