CITATION COUNTS

A Google Scholar Review suggests that to date (8.12.2015), I have a total of 3774 citations on publications since 1995, with an h-index of 35, and an i10-index of 76. Clearly, while several older papers from the 90s are still being cited, my publication rate per annum has improved, and since 2010 there have been 2328 citations, with an h-index of 28, and an i10-index of 62.

The most frequently cited paper is "Sexual abuse and suicidality: gender differences in a large community sample of adolescents" 2004, **G Martin**, HA Bergen, AS Richardson, L Roeger, S Allison. Child Abuse & Neglect 28 (5), 491-503. (200 citations) (Impact Factor of this journal is 3.25)

The second most frequently cited is "Adolescent suicide: music preference as an indicator of vulnerability" **G Martin**, M Clarke, C Pearce. Journal of the American Academy of Child & Adolescent Psychiatry 32 (3), 530-535 (154 citations) (Impact Factor of this journal is 6.64)

The third most frequently cited is "Parental bonding and vulnerability to adolescent suicide
G Martin, S Waite. Acta Psychiatrica Scandinavica 89 (4), 246-254 (136 citations)

(Impact Factor of this journal is 4.22)

In the last several years we have been very successful in getting papers published in international peer reviewed journals of high repute. In addition, rejection rates have been low, probably less than 30%, and usually our second choice of journal has taken a revised publication if it has been turned down by the first).

The *Journal of the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry* is the premier journal in Child Psychiatry, *Child Abuse and Neglect* is the premier journal in the abuse field, the *Journal of Adolescence* is highly regarded, as is the *Journal of Addiction Studies*. The *Journal of Nervous and Mental Diseases* is one of the most ancient journals in psychiatry and it has been an honour to be published in that journal. As far as suicide prevention goes (the (major focus of my work) the 2 major journals are the *Archives of Suicide Research* and *Suicide and Life-threatening Behaviour* and we have been published several times in both of these.

In Australia, both of the high quality journals published by the Royal and New Zealand College of Psychiatrists (*The Journal of the RANZCP*, and *Australasian Psychiatry*) have published several of our papers.

I have been most fortunate to have the capacity to create journals from scratch (eg *The Australian and New Zealand Journal of Family Therapy*, *Interface*, *Auseinetter*, and the *Australian eJournal for the Advancement of Mental Health*. All of these have at various times accepted my work for publication after it has been through a peer review process. In addition, I have been fortunate to be associated with organisations such as Suicide Prevention Australia, and the Australian Network for Promotion, Prevention and Early Intervention that have been keen to publish my editorials and other work. Finally I have also had many opportunities to complete literature reviews, and to provide final reports about clinical and research programs, and to review interstate services.

	I was brought up to consider medicine as 'service', and have tried to follow this tradition since qualification in 1967. I consider the personal motto of Prince Charles ('Tch Dien' meaning 'to serve') as echoing my on life work. I have a history of extensive public (mostly pro bono) service since my arrival in Australia in 1974, and have been involved in local, state and national groups since my arrival in Queensland. I have been part of a number of committees within The University of Queensland, but these committees seem to be re-invented frequently, and latterly I have largely been able to focus on research, teaching and clinical work. 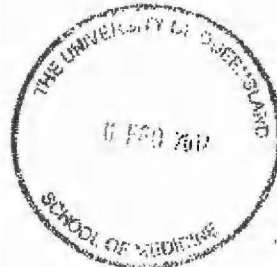

THIS AGREEMENT is made this 7 day of November 2011

BETWEEN STATE OF QUEENSLAND acting through the Department of Health of 147-163 Charlotte Street Brisbane in the State of Queensland.
("the State")

AND THE UNIVERSITY OF QUEENSLAND of Brisbane in the State of Queensland.
("the University")

RECITALS

- A. The parties have entered into a Primary Funding Agreement dated 18 December 2001.
- B. The Primary Funding Agreement recognises that various funding applications will be made by the University and in each case, the funding will be subject to the terms of the Primary Funding Agreement and a Secondary Funding Agreement.
- C. The parties have agreed that execution of a fresh Primary Funding Agreement will not be required in each case and that execution of a Secondary Funding Agreement will suffice.
- D. The State has approved a funding application by the University on the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement.

NOW THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. INTERPRETATION

- 1.1 In this Agreement, unless the context otherwise requires or the contrary intention appears, the following definitions apply -

"Agreement" means this document and all schedules and attachments to it.

"Commencement Date" means that date specified in Schedule 2.

"Completion Date" means that date specified in Schedule 2.

"Existing Material" means any material that exists at the Commencement Date and is incorporated into the Material.

"Funding" means that amount specified in Schedule 4.

"Intellectual Property Rights" means all copyright, patents and all rights in relation to inventions, trade marks and designs.

"Material" means all material including but not limited to documents, computer software, and data stored by any means which is created by or on behalf of the University for the purpose of developing, co-ordinating or providing the Services.

"Primary Funding Agreement" means the Agreement referred to in Recital A.

"Primary Funding Agreement" means the Agreement referred to in Recital A.

"Services" means the services specified in Schedule 1.

"State" means the State of Queensland acting through the Department of Health.

"University" means the University of Queensland.

- 1.2 A covenant or agreement on the part of two or more persons will be deemed to bind them jointly and severally.
- 1.3 A reference to a person includes a reference to corporations and other entities recognised by law.
- 1.4 The singular includes the plural and vice versa.
- 1.5 Words importing one gender include a reference to all other genders.
- 1.6 In the case of any inconsistency between a Schedule and a clause in this Agreement, the provisions of the clause will prevail to the extent of any inconsistency.
- 1.7 A reference to a statute, regulation, ordinance or local law extends to all statutes, regulations, ordinances or local laws amending, consolidating or replacing it.
- 1.8 A reference to the State and any government department or entity or other authority, association and body, whether statutory or otherwise, shall in the event of any such department, entity, authority, association or body ceasing to exist or being reconstituted, renamed or replaced or the powers or functions thereof being transferred to any other department, entity, authority, association or body, be deemed to refer respectively to the department, entity, authority, association or body established or constituted in lieu thereof and succeeding, or as nearly as may be, to the powers or functions thereof.
- 1.9 Where in this Agreement something is to be done on or by a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday in Queensland, it may be done on the next business day in Queensland.
- 1.10 Where a word or phrase is given a particular meaning in this Agreement, other parts of speech and grammatical form of that word or phrase have a corresponding meaning.
- 1.11 A reference to a clause, schedule or attachment is a reference to a clause, schedule or attachment to this Agreement and includes any amendment to same made in accordance with this Agreement.

2. ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

The University acknowledges that it has examined and has understood the contents of all documentation provided by the State to the University prior to seeking the Funding.

3. TERM

This Agreement will commence on the Commencement Date and unless previously terminated pursuant to clause 5, will expire on the Completion Date.

4. PRIMARY FUNDING AGREEMENT

The parties agree that the terms and conditions of the Primary Funding Agreement form part of this Agreement and they shall comply with those terms and conditions in so far as they are relevant to this Agreement.

5. GOODS AND SERVICES TAX (GST)

5.1 For the purposes of this clause --

- (a) "Adjustment Event" has the same meaning as in the GST Act;
- (b) "Adjustment Note" has the same meaning as in the GST Act;
- (c) "GST" has the same meaning as in the GST Act;
- (d) "GST Act" means *A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999* (Cth) as amended;
- (e) "Recipient Created Tax Invoice" (RCTI) has the same meaning as in the GST Act;
- (f) "Tax Invoice" has the meaning as in the GST Act; and
- (g) "Taxable Supply" has the same meaning as in the GST Act.

5.2 The Parties agree that the prices specified in this Agreement are GST exclusive.

5.3 In signing this Agreement the University is indicating it is registered for GST and ABN 63 942 912 684 is to be used for this project. The University agrees that the supply will be subject to GST to the extent required by the GST law.

5.4 The University acknowledges that it cannot enter into a Recipient Created Tax Invoice agreement if it is not registered for GST, even if it is required to be registered.

5.5 The University further agrees to the following conditions in regard to Recipient Created Tax Invoices (RCTI):

- (a) Queensland Health will issue RCTIs in respect of all taxable supplies made by the University to Queensland Health in return for payments/consideration from the Queensland Health, and provide a copy to the University within twenty-eight (28) days;
- (b) The University must remit the GST amount(s) to the Australian Taxation Office as required by the GST legislation;
- (c) Queensland Health will issue Recipient Created Adjustment Notes (RCAN) in respect of any adjustment events that occur under this Service Agreement, and provide a copy to the University within twenty-eight (28) days;
- (d) The University agrees not to issue Tax Invoices or Adjustment Notes in respect of these same supplies;

- (e) The University will notify Queensland Health within fourteen (14) days if it ceases to be registered for GST purposes, becomes aware of any reason for which its registration may be cancelled, or if it ceases to satisfy any of the RCTI requirements stated in the GST legislation.
- 5.6 The University will notify Queensland Health in writing if it wishes the RCTI agreement of Clause 5.4 of this Secondary Funding agreement to be cancelled and the cancellation will not take effect until the advice of the cancellation has been received by Queensland Health.
- 5.7 The University will notify Queensland Health in writing within fourteen (14) days of any change to its GST status or ABN; by completing the RCTI Amendment Form (Schedule 8).
- 5.8 Queensland Health is registered for GST purposes and its ABN is 66 329 169 412. Queensland Health will notify the University within fourteen (14) days if it ceases to be registered for GST purposes, becomes aware of any reason for which its registration may be cancelled, or if it ceases to satisfy any of the RCTI requirements stated in the GST legislation.
- 5.9 If the University becomes liable to remit GST in respect of any Taxable Supply the University makes to Queensland Health in accordance with this Agreement, the amount otherwise payable by Queensland Health under this Agreement will be increased by the amount of the GST liability ("the GST amount"). The GST amount will be payable by Queensland Health in the same manner and at the same time as the funding payable under this Agreement.
- 5.10 However, clause 5.8 of this Secondary Funding Agreement will have no application if the payments set out in Schedule 4 are stated to be inclusive of GST.
- 5.11 If the amount of GST recovered from Queensland Health under this Agreement differs, for any reason, from the amount of GST paid or payable by the University to the Commissioner of Taxation, including by reason of:
 - (a) an amendment to the GST law;
 - (b) the issue of or an alteration in a ruling or advice of the Commissioner of Taxation;
 - (c) a refund of GST to the University in respect of any Taxable Supply made under this Agreement; or
 - (d) a decision of any tribunal or court,then, subject to obtaining written approval or instruction from Queensland Health, the difference in amounts will be paid by or to Queensland Health, as the case may be.
- 5.12 Any GST amount paid by Queensland Health to the University must be deposited into an approved financial institution account and the interest earned may only be used in accordance with clause 16 of the Primary Funding Agreement.
