Dear Sir

I am writing to you to ask for you to support the retention of the Barrett Adolesent Centre. This centre specialises in the treatment and rehabilitation of adolesents in Queensland with mental health issues. It is an extended rehabilitation unit that focuses on the care of chronic and treatment resistant mental health issues. The centre allows youth to achieve their developmental milestones as well as reintergration into society. An holistic approach is used as well as a least restrictive environment. While some of the youth are involuntary the unit encourages voluntary admissions and adheres to minimal seclusions and does not use chemical or mechanical restraints.

Family and carers are actively involved in treatment outcomes and the youth have a strong voice in the direction of care.

A youths strengths are the focus of recovery and as soon as the youth is able they are intergrated into the community services that are available.

There is an attached school that specialises in engaging with youth who have not been able to attend school sometimes for many years. the program is tailored to the youths needs.

During the thirty years the program has been running many lives have been saved by being an inpatient in the centre, these youth have gone on to leads productive and fullfilling lives with families and careers as well as tertiary education.

Past patients have often kept in contact with the centre and the staff and at times will attend events at the centre and speak to current patients about their lived experiences.

This facility is the only one of its kind in Queensland and as patients have stated "its their last chance". Many are unable to go home due to abuse issues or having been abandoned. The centre assists the youth to identify where the would like to live and supports this as well as further schooling or finding employment. The staff liase with NGO's, other departments such as child safety and with the education department. Close contact is kept with the referring agencies such as CYMHS, Headspace as well as other sources. There has been strong support for the continuation of this service from experts in adolescent mental health such as Professor's Patrick Mc Gorry, Brett Mc Dermott, Graham Martin as well as many others. the family and patients began a petition and their is a parlimentry e-petition as well as support from many others.

The State government is closing the centre after advise from mental health central office and the health district is supporting the closure due mainly to financial issues.

This centre is a state wide service that is unique in Queensland and is being modeled by other states and countries.

The health district has stated that the closure was in line with national mental health stratergies but after reviewing some of their outdated and selective examples for the closure this excuse does mirror the national mental health stratergies.

The building is old and needs replacing but the service provided is vibrant and has a dedicated core of staff that specialise in the complex treatment of adolescent mental health.

If the unit cannot stay in this district or at this site then there is a need to retain the service at another site. The director of the unit D.R. Trevor Sadler is highly respected by his collegues and is a saint to past and present patients. He has dedicated many years to the centre and the closure has aged him. It is an injustice and disservice to the the youth of Queensland that because of not being "sexy" or "Media worthy" and "not of voting age"

these adolescents will lose what is possibly there last chance for a fullfilling life to save money. I beg you as a person as with a voice to support this centre and the vital work it does.
